


















OMG!! It already is August, and it is hot!!

It sounds ridiculous to be even mentioning hot weather . . . during the summer . . . in Taft. After all, what do we expect? It is Taft. The extreme heat of the typical summer in Taft cannot possible come as a surprise! Yet, every year, I hear myself complaining about the heat, using it as an excuse to put off chores and errands that require me to leave the shelter of air-conditioning. And, sadly, more and more each year, I hear—out of my own mouth—words that I can attribute only to my mother: "I'm going to pass on that. It's just too hot!" (Don't get me started on the whole aging thing, a different but related issue.)

So, since it is August and the weather is hot, it must be time for us to think about school starting. August 15 will be here in no time. Classified staff folks have worked all summer to prepare and repair, making sure our great educational facilities are ready for another safe year. School administrators in our town are already back at work, and most teachers will officially return on August 10. (Many already have begun preparing their classrooms.) For this old school administrator, **this,** rather than January 1, is the beginning of a new year. It is that refreshing, promising time when the slate is clean for both school personnel and for students.

The beginning of the school year is when planning and goal-setting re-calibrate personal and corporate missions, and the chance to accomplish great new endeavors is set before both students and staff. Most sectors of our society like business, healthcare, government, safety, and human services, must create, repair, and adjust while producing, a bit like building the dam while the river continues to flow. Education, particularly public school elementary and high school education, on the other hand, has a bit of a shut-down and a start-up component that allows for some breathing and (if done correctly) some reflection. It is this *timing* attribute, the ability of school districts and school staffs to engineer the fresh start that can make a huge impact on the success of an educational program.

So, here we go! Back-to-school backpacks, lunchboxes, school registration (now on-line at Taft High), school supplies, shots, physicals, haircuts, clothes . . . The practical side of starting a new school year for the families of students begins with getting to school on time, but it includes homework times, bath times, bedtimes, lunch prep, child care, carpools, music lessons, dance lessons, caring for animal projects, soccer practice, football practice, volleyball practice, cheer practice . . . The beginning of school signals the return to organization and routine for most of us. Even the social lives of folks without students in their homes revolve around school. The Fall brings football, volleyball, soccer, band, choir, and drama offerings from our school kids, and most of us support our young people in some manner with our presence at these important school events or by purchasing wrapping paper, "finest" chocolate, or gourmet popcorn.

This celebration of the beginning of a new school year leads me to an often-overlooked, sometimes unappreciated, seldom-considered fact: the greatest supporters of our schools in Taft and its surrounding areas, from pre-school through Taft College, is our Taft business community. Local sports teams, high school campus clubs, yearbooks, youth organizations, and scholarship programs could not survive without the continued support of our town's business community. From the corporate giants with a presence outside our City limits to the Mom and Pop stores on Center Street, remember who helps to make "school" as we know it in Taft a great experience for our students. And have a great 2016-2017 school year!


JULY IS PURPLE RIBBON MONTH Keeping Kids Safe in and around Motor Vehicles

(Bakersfield, CA) - Last Friday, July 22nd, it was a mild morning in the Mojave Desert, with morning temperatures in the 80's, and a car air-condition cooled to 76 Degrees. The car was turned off, and the timer started. In just 10 minutes, the temperature inside the car was 93.2 Degrees. In 25 minutes, it had reached the potentially deadly temperature of 107 Degrees. It only takes a few minutes for a car to heat up and become deadly to a child inside. As summer temperatures rise, more kids are at risk—the death toll this summer has already reached 23 children nationwide (Source: Jan Null, CCM, Department of Meteorology and Climate Science, San Jose State University, http://noheatstroke.org). Please join the Department of Human Services, with support from First 5 Kern, the Kern County Network for Children, and our local public safety & community partners, as we continue out "Purple Ribbon Month" awareness campaign by joining in some of our scheduled Purple Ribbon Month Demonstrations.

Join the Department of Human Services at these safety demonstrations, where we use a very visual demonstration on how quickly cars heat up.

July 31 is National Heatstroke Prevention Day. We recognize this day as we work to get the message out about the dangers of heatstroke and how to prevent these tragedies from occurring. 
These events hope to raise public awareness about "Kaitlyn's Law", passed in California in 2001, that makes it a citable offense for parents to leave children under the age of 6 unattended in a motor vehicle without the supervision of someone at least 12 years of age. The Law was named for 6 month old Kaitlyn Marie Russell, who died on August 15th, 2000, after being left behind in a hot van by a caregiver. July is Purple Ribbon Month in memory of Kaitlyn and all the children who have lost their lives to preventable injuries in and around cars, and in order to educate ad increase public awareness about all of the dangers of leaving children unattended in or around motor vehicles. 
