Executive Directions

It is December . . . already. Just forming those words in my mouth reminds me that I am aging. Every New Year's my mother used to say, "Before we know it, it will be December!" Now it is I who is proclaiming the rapid march through the year.

December also marks the switching of gears: November reminds us of those people, events, and possessions for which we are thankful. December tends to focus on people for whom we should provide, events for which we are responsible, and possessions we do not have. If you are not one who naturally lives on the sunny side of life, you may have difficulty with the "Merry" in Christmas.

Most of us, however, enjoy the holiday season because of, for no other reason, the change in weather. The crispness of the morning air helps us to forget the unrelenting heat of most months in Taft. Winter in Taft, when it finally gets here, is a beautiful change.

I have an earring for every occasion, and most K -12 educators, well, at least K-8 . . . OK, K-5 teachers have a necklace, a necktie, or a scarf that screams Christmas. For many people, admitting they are excited about Valentine's Day or Easter is silliness, but dressing "Christmas-y" is totally acceptable.
- 3. People renew relationships. Apart from class reunions, Christmas is the most traditional time of year for folks to catch up on the activities of friends. Although Christmas cards are not as popular as they once were, people still tend to communicate with out-of-town friends and relatives, bringing people closer, even for a short time.

Whatever the holiday season means to you, whether you celebrate the birth of Jesus or anticipate family time and presents, I hope you will enjoy your holiday this year. In many ways this has been a difficult year economically for our City and many of its families, but we hope this Christmas brings hope and happiness. On behalf of the Taft District Chamber, we wish you and yours a very Merry Christmas.



Taft "Adopt a Senior for Christmas" Want to be Part of the Magic!




Optimal Hospice Light Up a Life

Public workshops & "walking audits" to identify regional walking and bicycling needs

When and Where:

Thursday, December 15, 2016, at 9:00 A.M at West Side Recreation and Park District,

500 Cascade Place, Taft, CA 93268

Kern County residents are encouraged to help plan the future of the region's walking and bicycling network by participating in a series of "walking audits" and community workshops that will identify challenges and opportunities for people traveling on foot and bicycle.

These events are part of the Kern Region Active Transportation Plan (ATP), a regional planning effort led by the Kern Council of Governments (COG) to improve walking, bicycling and transit access throughout Kern County. Working with local, regional and statewide partner agencies and organizations, Kern COG aims to develop project and program recommendations to make walking, bicycling and transit integral parts of daily life for residents and visitors alike.

Audit participants will walk with professional planning staff in communities throughout the Kern region to point out specific parts of town, intersections, corridors and other areas where bicycling and walking are challenging. Challenges often include damaged infrastructure, system gaps, line-of-sight or vehicle speed concerns or other issues that make walking or riding a bike difficult.

The public is also invited to attend a series of community workshops designed to gather feedback about the existing walking and bicycling environment and how it may be improved. The audits and workshops will run from Nov. 30 through Dec. 15 throughout the region. See Taft's date and location below.

Residents are also encouraged to visit the project website, www.kernatp.org . Website visitors can complete an online survey, illustrate current and desired walking/bicycling routes via an interactive map, and learn more about the overall planning effort.

The data, opinions and information gathered from these outreach efforts will be included in the Active Transportation Plan, which will serve as the basis for future funding and grant requests to support and encourage bicycle and pedestrian travel, including new or improved walkways, bikeways, trails and crossings.


