

#### George Runner Responds to Gas Tax Cut

Sacramento - Board of Equalization
Vice Chair George Runner issued the
following statement after joining a 3-2
board vote to lower the state excise tax
on gasoline by 2.2 cents per gallon
effective July 1, 2016:

"Today's vote was simply a matter of fairness. Californians overpaid gas tax last year because of a bizarre formula known as the 'gas tax sweep' passed by lawmakers in 2010. Lowering the rate is the right thing to do, am I'm sure Californians will welcome the reduction.

"Unfortunately, even after the cut goes into effect, Californians will still pay some of the highest taxes in the nation. What we need now is for lawmakers to simplify our tax laws and look for ways to provide value for the money that Californians send to government."

Coming up on **Saturday, April 16, 2016**, the County of Kern will celebrate its 150<sup>th</sup> Birthday with a wonderful expo, with all supervisorial districts in the County being represented. This event will take place at Pioneer Village, adjacent to the Kern County Museum, near the baseball fields on Chester.

The City of Taft will be represented thanks to the hard work of the City Manager's office. They have been in on the planning since the early Fall of 2015, but they graciously did not require the attendance of anyone else from Taft due to the time all were spending on the 105<sup>th</sup> Oildorado celebration.

The Chamber came on board last week, meeting with the Board of Trade at the old Fellows Hotel in Pioneer Village. Belinda Cole, Assistant to our City Manager, Craig Jones, had been keeping our office up on the discussions and general plans for the event, but the time came when we needed to get this thing planned and up and running.

So here's the "straight scoop" on the 150<sup>th</sup> Birthday celebration: if you are a business that has been on the West Side for around 100 years, you need to be included. If you

have existed for around 100 years as a club or group of individuals with a name, e.g., Taft Petroleum Club, Rotary, Kiwanis, you need to be part of this. If you are a building or landmark that is old, e.g., The Historic Fort, the Midway Cemetery, you should participate in this. If you know about the history of our City, have pictures, memorabilia, trucks, random stuff, e.g., the West Kern Oil Museum, come on down! Schools? Conley has much of which to be proud—join us! Taft Union High School just turned 100 a few years ago . . . perfect!! If you are known to celebrate the past on a regular basis, say, like maybe OILDORADO . . . you may need to be on board.

The Chamber, partnering with the City of Taft, will be spearheading the effort to make a display of our Westside contributions to the County of Kern. ### Want to be part of Kern's 150th Anniversary Party? Here's how...

It was 1866 and gold fever had cooled to the point that local pioneers could think straight enough to campaign for the formation of a new county after a similar effort had petered out a few years before.

The mines were humming but no longer frantic, and commerce, agriculture and trade were taking off, making the necessary trips to the county seat in Visalia — on horse, no less — something of a drag.

And so prominent men of the day, including Col. Thomas Baker, got cracking.

This time around, the proposed name would be Kern instead of Buena Vista — what the Spaniards had called the southern San Joaquin — and the land would be carved from surrounding areas, predominantly Tulare and Los Angeles counties.

And so an act calling for the organiza-

tion of the county and the establishment of Havilah as the county seat was approved by the California Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Frederick F. Low in April 1866.

Which means there's some celebrating to do in 2016.

On April 16, the county will throw a 150th birthday bash at the Kern County Museum — also marking a big anniversary this year, its 75th. The plan is to feature the history, contributions and people of all areas of the sprawling county, said Teresa Hitchcock, Board of Trade executive director, who is co-organizing the festivities.

"We're looking for sponsors, people who may have interesting stories or artifacts or pictures," she said Tuesday. "We are also looking for unique things made in Kern County and local artists who would like to display their artwork. I think we have some phenomenally talented people."

A planning meeting at the museum on Monday offered a preliminary status report of the activities for the event, which is scheduled from noon to 8 p.m. There will be a model of the famed Tehachapi Loop, some old west "gunslingers" will make their way down from the Kern River Valley, at least one mariachi group has been lined up, and planners talked about other attractions, music and food possibilities.

The committee has not finalized booth fees, but commercial vendors probably will pay in the ballpark of \$150, whereas fees for arts and crafts booths will be around \$25. The county is using money leftover from the centennial celebration in 1966.

"It's \$8,000, a tiny amount of money, not some huge gonna-save-the-county -budget amount of money," Hitchcock said, "so we're looking for donations."

The event will be family-friendly and a field day for history lovers, Hitchcock said.

"There is a lot of things out there that folks in Bakersfield don't even know about," she said. "There are unique food vendors people might not have experienced, to showcase what each area has to offer."

## AVID program at Lincoln Junior High provides students tools to succeed

Lincoln Junior High School teacher Amy Hill remembers a student who tried really hard in school to succeed, but struggled nonetheless.

The student, a native Spanish speaker, had never learned how to study properly, how to organize his workload appropriately, or to think critically. It was no wonder he also didn't think twice about what he could do after graduating from high school.

But in eighth grade, the student was enrolled in AVID after being recommended for the program. AVID put him on the track to success, said Hill, who is also the AVID director for Taft City School District.

Now in high school, the same student is on the right track, and is gearing up for college.

"I remember him feeling so proud of how organized he was, and how his grades were improving," Hill said. "He was able to push himself because of this program."

Through AVID, Hill said, students learn the ability to challenge themselves, and to not give up when faced with a difficult task.


"AVID teaches them to think critically, and learn that they can accomplish a task when they get to that challenge," Hill said. "They come into AVID struggling in school, but are then able to step it up and learn what success can be like."

#### WHAT IS AVID?

AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination, and the program has been offered at Taft City School District for more than 10 years. Students apply for the program, and must go through an interview process before being accepted.

In short, the program aims to help students who are traditionally underrepresented in higher education to prepare for college and their prospective careers. AVID's mission is "to close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society."

Recent nationwide studies of the AVID program, which was founded in 1980, show that 78 percent of AVID seniors in high school are accepted to a college or university, and 87 percent of AVID graduates enrolled in a second year of

college, compared to 77 percent of students overall.

Part of the course focuses on teaching students organizational skills – keeping school materials



and binders neat, and managing their time appropriately, for example. AVID also focuses on reading and writing, communication skills, and critical thinking and study skills. It also provides students with academic support from college tutors, who are paid for by the district.

"The program helps them to advocate to learn for themselves," Hill said. "It helps them learn skills to be ready for high school, and ultimately for higher education."

In fact, the students at Lincoln have taken several field trips to major universities in California to learn all about higher education, and how to apply for colleges. The junior high AVID program also connects with the AVID program offered at Taft Union High School, so that students who continue in the program through high school get a seamless experience.

At Lincoln Junior High, the class is offered as an elective course. District staff members who are involved in AVID are

trained at the national level to use AVID-approved strategies in TCSD schools.

Parents of Taft students who are accepted into the program should note that the program is not offered at all schools in Kern County -- Taft City School District has made it a priority to offer the program at Lincoln because of its success, said Lincoln Principal Brandi Swearengin.

#### HOW TO BECOME A PART OF AVID

One of the focuses of AVID is to target students who may not have the support at home, perhaps because they have two working parents, who also may not have higher education experience. Many of the students currently enrolled in AVID are minorities, or first-generation in the United States.

Overall, the program provides that extra support that students may need to jump to the next level of success, Swearengin said.

"AVID provides them structure at school so that you can be successful if they decide to go to college," Swearengin said.

To apply, students need to have good attendance, earn above a 2.0 GPA, and have an interest in going to college. Students must also be motivated to succeed, are willing to

work hard to reach their goals, and are typically well behaved in their classes, school officials said.

The program is open to all sixth-, seventh- and eighthgrade students at Lincoln Junior High. If students meet the criteria, they go through an application process, followed by an interview with AVID staff. Parents and their students should note that past school years have experienced waiting lists to get into the AVID program at Lincoln.

AVID staff members have hosted parent informational nights in the recent semesters, which include a presentation on AVID and dinner. School officials hope to host another session this coming spring.
